*Dissertation*: “Just Doing My Job: Normative Dimensions of Social Roles”

*Abstract*: “What should I do?” Often, our answers make reference to our social roles: we ask what we should do as lawyers, citizens, or parents. But this confronts us with problems. Consider a would-be whistleblower, a wife challenging the gendered division of household labor, or the conflicted police officer Javert from *Les Misérables*. These agents feel there is a genuine conflict between the norms of their roles and moral considerations. Philosophical orthodoxy downplays social roles as a background feature of our moral lives: either their importance can be explained in moral terms, or they are mere conventions that can and often should be discarded. I argue that this yields phenomenologically and theoretically impoverished accounts of the normative world. Taking roles seriously prompts revision to orthodox views of role-occupants’ reasons for action, blameworthiness, and responsibility for structural injustice.
